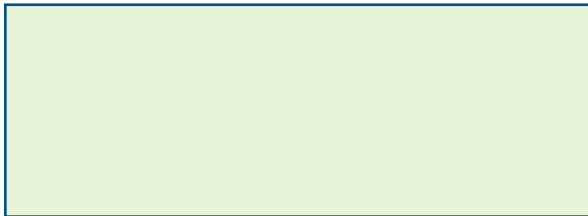
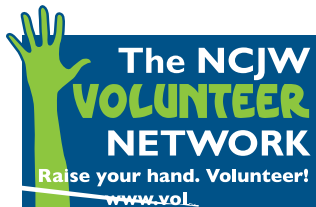

Be a warm and friendly voice checking in on a homebound senior. The NCJW Telephone Reassurance Program needs volunteer callers of any age for this growing need. You will attend a short training session before you are matched with a homebound senior to call weekly. Your phone calls provide a personal connection for someone who has little contact with anyone outside his or her home. You must be a member of NCJW to volunteer.

New Eyes for the Needy

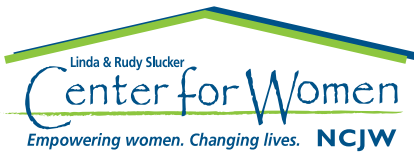
