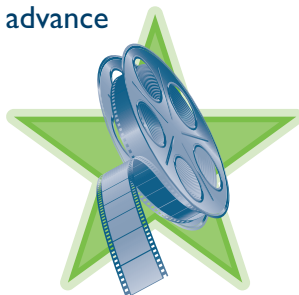

JOB READINESS PROGRAM* provides Displaced Homemakers with job readiness skills and employment referrals. A Displaced Homemaker is someone who must suddenly enter the workplace due to widowhood, divorce, separation, disabled spouse, or spouse deployed in the military. No fee.
